

Type 1 Assessment: Sample Questions

- What is the best way to learn about a culture that is different from your own?
- Share an experience in which you were successful/unsuccessful while interacting with someone of a different culture than your own. (Give as much detail as necessary to describe this experience).
- How important is it to learn about cultures that are different from your own?
- Is it more important for certain individuals to learn about various cultures than others (i.e. teachers, doctors)?





Type 2 Assessment: Simulation Steps

LEARNING CULTURES

- introduction
- training
- Practice

SIMULATION

- exchange observers
- exchange groups to visit
- debrief with culture between each group visit

DEBRIEFING

- whole-class (describe other culture)
- small mixed group Q & A session
- whole-class lessons learned
- reflection (writing and sharing)
- two-week follow-up debriefing

Type 3 Assessment: Ideas for Future Implementation

- Create lesson plans
 Create simulation to present to k-12 students
- Observe k-12 classroom and takes notes on communication/ interactions
