
14 years of documenting and learning from 56 women leaders in peacebuilding and human rights from 38 countries

Problem Statement: Effective peacebuilding requires strong local and global cooperation. Yet in most cases international actors and local peacebuilders fail to form effective partnerships, thus harming the potential for peacebuilding efforts to succeed.



Why Narrative Inquiry?



The Methodology Emphasizes:

- Reflective peacebuilding through storytelling
- Trust building processes between Writer and PeaceMaker
 - The co-creation of knowledge
 - Authenticity of voice

The Women PeaceMakers Program, based at the Joan B. Kroc. Institute for Peace & Justice (and of the University of San Diego's Kroc School of Peace & Studies), annually hosts four women from around the world who have been involved in human rights and peacemaking efforts in their countries. Women PeaceMakers are paired with Peace Writers to document their stories of living in conflict and building peace in their communities and nations. These are their stories.
