

The Moran Center for Global Leadership, housed at Villanova School of Business, is dedicated to promoting cross-cultural awareness, ethical international business relationships and responsible global leadership. We pursue these objectives through international educational programs, research, and service and outreach activities.



Developing Ethical Global Leaders

- Villanova University is a Roman Catholic institution founded by the Order of Saint Augustine in 1842.
- Villanova encourages students, faculty and staff to engage in service experiences and research, both locally and globally, so they learn from others, provide public service to the community and help create a more sustainable world.
- Villanovans provide more than 250,000 hours of service annually and is host to the world's largest student-run Special Olympics festival in the world.
- The 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) outlined in the 2030 UN Agenda offer an opportunity for us to evaluate how our universities and organizations contribute.

Developing Global Leaders - Curriculum

- The Global Leadership Fellows (GLF) was established to develop global leadership competencies throughout the undergraduate experience.
- The Backpack to Briefcase program is an innovative initiative, integrating professional development into the core business curriculum throughout a student's four-year academic program.
- MBA students participate in a global practicum and a social enterprise consulting practicum, where they work with a client firm that is serving the common good in the Greater Philadelphia Community







Developing Global Leaders - International Service

"Local solutions to local problems"

- •Serve with people and partner organizations who work every day to improve the lives of impoverished and marginalized people in their own communities
- •Complement class work with first hand experiences of life at the margins of society and exposure to the knowledge and insights of people they encounter
- •Examine issues of injustice and develop a life-long commitment to working for the Common Good
- •Opportunities for Villanova faculty and staff to serve as an Advisor employees are granted one week annually of paid leave to volunteer
- •Opportunities for student leadership juniors/seniors that have already participated previously may serve as student leaders

















International Service Initiatives

- Villanova University began a partnership with Catholic Relief Services (CRS) in 2005 and works collaboratively to advance global solidarity through education, research, advocacy and service.
- Students work in multidisciplinary teams (Business, Engineering, GIS, Nursing and French majors) that focus on clean-water and sanitation projects; education on microfinance lending; mother/child health; agriculture valuechains
- Student teams are placed with three faith-based, churchaffiliated organizations that have worked in partnership with CRS in Madagascar for several years
- Alumni endowment covers all costs for students and faculty advisors



Scholarships & Fellowships

- In AY 1718, the Moran Center for Global Leadership awarded \$246,250 in scholarships and fellowships in support of international education.
- Funding supported 63 students from VSB, CLAS and COE studying and working in 16 different countries
- Funding is provided by a combination of generous alumni endowments and a foundation grant




