

Countering Violent Extremist Ideologies

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Some initial definitions:

• Ideology:

a system of ideas and ideals, especially one which forms the basis of economic or political theory and policy: *the ideology of democracy*.

 the ideas and manner of thinking characteristic of a group, social class, or individual: a critique of bourgeois ideology.

• Extremist:

• a person or a group who holds extreme or fanatical political or religious views, especially one who resorts to or advocates extreme action: *political extremists* | [as modifier] : an extremist conspiracy.

• Violent:

 using or involving physical force intended to hurt, damage, or kill someone or something: a violent confrontation with protesters.



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EXTREMIST IDEOLOGIES:

 Extremist means 'to be far outside' the acceptable norms of society.

• ACCEPTABLE

 However, every society has a different understanding of what is acceptable.

Education is not neutral

 The relation between education and political life reveals the project of education in modern and postmodern times by unfolding the necessary critical thinking elements conducive to novel proposals on education.

Education can either make a creative contribution to the betterment of political life through education, or provide an analysis of the field by identifying the major contributors and some of its continuum challenges.

O The role of education is not solely the understanding, interpretation and critique of which has already been theorized and practiced but also the reformulation of education itself.
