KNOWLEDGE

- Understand fundamental concepts of culture, globalism, and intercultural communication.
- Maintain an awareness of world and current events.
- Identify topics of global significance within content areas.
- Understand anticipated student outcomes for global competence and how to assess them.
- Know one's own cultural construct.
- Know how to identify culturally and age-appropriate resources.

SKILLS

- Promote content-appropriate investigations of the world.
- Promote active listening, critical thinking, and perspective recognition.
- Facilitate learning experiences in which students effectively communicate ideas to local and global audiences.
- Assess students' global competence development.
- Promote global engagement, respect for diversity, and conflict resolution.
- Use technology to connect across classrooms, nations, and cultures.

DISPOSITIONS

- Demonstrate an interest in and engagement with the world.
- Continue active learning about cultures, communities, and global concerns.
- Prioritize the development of students' global competence.
- Be reflective about own's own strengths and weaknesses in cultural awareness, knowledge, and pedagogical competence.
- Recognize multiple perspectives and respect other ways of knowing.
- Advocate for global education and social justice.

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
