Peer Lessons on HIV/AIDS

BELIEVE that one of the most satisfying experiences for an educator to have is the opportunity to be taught by one of their own students. Like many Peace Corps Volunteers around the world, I continuously tried to incorporate lessons of civics, humanity, and social consciousness into my daily English lessons. As the percentage of people living with HIV and AIDS in Ukraine is among the highest in Eurasia, volunteers in Ukraine focus a great deal of effort working with schools, organizations, and communities to educate others about this epidemic. During the final week of my two-year service, my students at Brody Gymnasium decided to arrange a number of lessons for me. One of the lessons that I will never forget was an HIV/AIDS presentation completely organized and co-facilitated by one of my 11th grade students. In collaboration with a local social worker, they taught a group of 10th and 11th grade students and teachers about how HIV is
