What is a Language Pledge?

Simply put:



Available Research

- Little in the way of documented research regarding language gains via a language pledge and gains made by students enrolled in traditional programming.
- Some documentation to support gains made by learning language abroad versus the domestic classroom.
- Logic: If exposure to native speakers abroad results in a broader gain in language skills, required communication in the local language should result in even more successful results.

Study from Frontiers

Statistical study of 40 University of Colorado (Boulder) language students

- 20 students remained at home
- 20 studied abroad
 - All students were non-heritage
 - 2 years of study prior to participation.

Study from Frontiers

Testing method

- Baseline testing of both groups prior to departure
- Testing at conclusion of semester
- Testing 13 weeks later

Results in a Nutshell

"...students who spent a semester studying [away] were found to have made greater gains in oral proficiency and in several aspects of oral fluency compared to those who studied at their home university in the United States."

Advantages of Choosing a Language Pledge Program?

 Forced to avoid the native-tongue comfort-zone


"...recent work has suggested that students are not necessarily "immersed" in the native speech community...that some students do not use the target language as much as has been believed nor do they consistently avail themselves of the numerous opportunities to participate in the native culture as we may have expected." (Frank, 1997; Pellegrino, 1998; Wilkinson, 1995).




The Main Disadvantage of a Language Pledge

The stress of limited vocabulary

- Double-edge sword; this stress also serves as a motivator to learn additional vocabulary
- The inability to communicate can often build more stress
- Typically results in a positive cycle of learning


Why does it work?
