Management Development Program Trainers

USCIS ELIS and Form I-539

Only ELIS customers who submitted or started and saved a draft a Form I-539 application before June 15, 2015, may still access their application in USCIS ELIS. All other customers who need to file a Form I-539

application will need to file a paper application.

Technical Issues With U.S. Consular Data System Causing Summer 2015 Visa and Passport Delays

The U.S. Department of State is experiencing technical difficulties with its "Consular Consolidated Database" (CCD) system, which is used to facilitate the issuance of U.S. passports and visas. The Department of State continues to make progress on fixing the issue, and has been regularly updating their website with status information. The DOS website updates are reproduced below. NAFSA is monitoring the situation, and has asked the Department of State to inform us of any developments.

Focus on STEM OPT

The F-1 STEM optional practical training (OPT) benefit has been the focus of recent interest that international educators should be aware of. The Department of Homeland Security will likely propose reformulating that benefit in response to several factors, including an Obama administration executive action proposal to "strengthen and extend" STEM OPT, a lawsuit pending in federal court that challenges STEM OPT, and some congressional opposition to OPT without added safeguards. NAFSA provides updates on this topic on their website.
