Twelve Yemeni students at Edmonds Community College have been in the news lately, as they are making plans for what to do when their scholarship program ends in June. These students will have completed a three-year scholarship program, but are unable to return to Yemen due to the conflict there. Edmonds has been working closely with each student to help them plan for their futures. Students' plans include transferring to four-year universities, working to save money for school, living with American families, and working as resident assistants (RAs) at Edmonds.

Global Student Mobility

Join the University of Idaho, Tacoma Community College and Chemeketa Community College at the Fall 2017 GSM Roadshow October 2, 4th or 6th.

Global Student Mobility (GSM) is a free portal for US schools to connect with educational recruitment agencies. They hold a semiannual roadshow and the Fall 2017 GSM USA Roadshow (held in OR, WA and ID) is now open for US Educational Institutions to register.

The basic format is that educators will have a schedule of 12 meetings (30 minutes each) with agencies of their choosing booked in advance with Marcom eSchedule PRO. We will target to bring at least 20 agencies with focus on SE Asia and to register 60 educators over the 3 fair locations. We have already confirmed 16 agencies (please see list <u>here</u>) and expect 20 to be confirmed shortly.
