

 - Visa help



Pro – face to face interaction



Online Formats/Platform Options

Online Pre-Departure Orientation and Quiz Instructions: Welcome to the Study Abroad Office pre-departure orientation. This orientation session is designed to prepare you for your study abroad experience, and consists of two parts: the first part is online and the second part is held in-person, divided by countries. All parts of the orientation are mandatory. The online portion of pre-departure orientation must be completed before the in-person portion. More information about the in-person orientation is available at the end of the online orientation. There is no time limit to this orientation, but it should take about 30 minutes. Section 1/7, Part 1/1: The Study Abroad Website The study abroad website is full of helpful information. Much of the information covered in this orientation session can be referenced back to the study abroad website. It is particularly important to read through the Before Your Program, During Your Program, and After Your Program sections of the website so that you are familiar with where you are in the study abroad process and what to expect in the coming months. All of the above Section 2/7: Academics Part 1/4:Study Abroad Placeholder Course In order to transfer credits back to KSU and keep your full-time student status, you must enroll in the study abroad placeholder course MLANG001. You will be enrolled in the MLANG001 course by the Study Abroad Office after you have completed the online orientation. Once the classes you took abroad are transferred back to KSU, the MLANG001 class is removed from your academic record. The MLANG001 course allows you to remain in full-time student status and remain eligible for financial aid by enrolling you in a minimum of 12 credit hours for the Fall or Spring semesters or 5 credit hours in the Summer. You must take a minimum of 12 credit hours abroad to transfer back to K-State when studying abroad for a semester. You back to K-State when studying abroad for a summer. Soups, bread, rice dishes are common. Cassava and plantain are recipe staples. Examples of staple dishes: Fufu, Banku, and Kenkey. Porridge or grits is common for breakfast.

Good to Know

- -People don't make exact change except from the next largest note.
- -Tipping is similar to the U.S. standard.
- -Ghanaians are very friendly. Don't be afraid to ask people questions if you are lost or need to know something.
- -Homosexuality is illegal.
- -If you buy traditional crafts that don't look brand new, you will have to prove you bought them and that they are not items of historical significance. You get this proof rom the national museum in Accra or Arts Centre.

Cultural tidbits

- -Friends will hold hands when together.
- -Ghanaians tend to be very assertive.
- -Greeting others is very important, and is considered impolite if you don't greet someone.

Communication

-Good idea to buy a monthly, pay as you go type cell phone when you arrive.

Transportation

-Taxi and Troto (mini-buses): don't get in an empty taxi without agreeing on a price first. Not recommended for long distances.

-Buses: STC is the government run bus system and are high quality and inexpensive.
