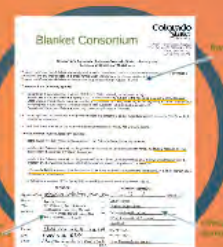





Using Financial Aid

Many students who study abroad do so with the assistance of various forms of financial aid. Students who qualify for federal, state or institutional aid in the form of grants, loans, or scholarships through the University of Kansas may apply these awards from the Financial Aid and Scholarships (FAS) office toward study abroad provided that they are enrolled in a study abroad program through the Office of Study Abroad (OSA) at the University of Kansas. Students are urged to educate themselves about their own particular situation and their eligibility for minimum/maximum awards while choosing a study abroad program.

Any student who wishes to receive financial aid to study abroad is encouraged to make an appointment with a Financial Aid Counselor at the Financial Aid and Scholarships office (KU Visitor Center, 765-364-4700) to discuss options and processes. Bring copies of program costs to the appointment with you. Program costs can be found online on the top of each program brochure page under the "Program Cost" section.
