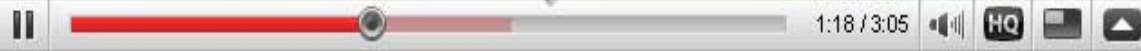



The students, known as Little Rock Nine, will always be remembered for paving the path for many future generations.
