Community College Update

SEVP announces exception to full course of study requirement for California community colleges. The following SEVIS Broadcast was issued by SEVP:

"In recognition of the on-going financial crisis affecting community colleges in California, the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) has developed a "Decision by SEVP Director" outlining the provisions available to the designated School officials (DSOs) at these schools. We emphasize that a copy of this Director's decision should be in the file of any F or M status international student whose Full Course of Study requirements are determined under the terms of this policy decision. SEVP will contact the California Community Colleges Chancellor's office periodically to confirm any changes to the financial situation, and subsequently determine if a continuation or adjustment of the terms of the "Decision by SEVP Director" is warranted."

Since this broadcast message was issued on December 17, 2009, Mt. San Antonio College has referred students to the college's International Student Advisors to determine if they are eligible to drop below a full course of study. This Spring term, ten F-1 students (of 400) have been authorized.

International Scholar Update

Prevailing wage determinations are currently taking 5-9 weeks. Unfortunately many schools report determinations that are incorrect or are too high for their needs. As a result, many schools are leaving the safe harbor of the prevailing wage process and making their own determinations based on the <u>U.S. Department of Labor's worksheet</u> and other guidelines.

There are still plenty of cap-subject H-1Bs available, according to the latest USCIS data. When advising, it may be best to recommend filing soon, as the cap may be reached at any time.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) <u>announced that it has redesigned the permanent resident</u> <u>card</u> ("green card"). The new card has new security features and is actually colored green, as its name always suggested.

USCIS released guidance on the <u>automatic extension of F-1 student status</u> with pending cap-subject H-1B petitions (the "Cap-Gap" provision).
