International Scholar Update

Recently there have been delays with H-1B standard processing cases. Even though the processing time published on http://www.uscis.gov/ states 2 months, petitioners have reported 3 months is more accurate. In addition, USCIS has issued Requests for Evidence for standard processing and premium processing cases that appeared approvable. Please report erroneous RFEs to the NAFSA IssueNet. Some RFEs question if the petitioner is subject to the new, additional fee under Public Law 111-230; we suggest attaching a notice to your H-1B petition explaining that your school is not H-1B dependent and thus exempt from that fee, if appropriate.

On July 20, USCIS clarified guidance on O-1s and the gap between scheduled events. Read more.
