NAFSA PUBLICATIONS RIGHTS AND PERMISSIONS

Do I need permission to link to NAFSA publications or web pages?

NAFSA encourages and permits text links to content, including NAFSA publications, on the website, www.nafsa. org, provided: (a) any text-only link must clearly be marked "NAFSA: Association of International Educators"; (b) the appearance, position, and other aspects of either the link or the host website may not be such as to damage or dilute the goodwill associated with NAFSA's name and trademarks; (c) the appearance, position, and other aspects of either the link or the host website may not create the false appearance that an entity other than NAFSA is associated with, endorsed by, or sponsored by NAFSA; (d) the link, when activated by a user, must display this website full-screen and not with a "frame" on the linked website; and (e) NAFSA reserves the right to revoke its consent to the link at any time at its sole discretion.

Do I need permission to reuse, reproduce, or translate a NAFSA publication?

Any republication, reproduction, or translation of all or part of a NAFSA publication is expressly prohibited, unless NAFSA or the copyright holder of the material has expressly granted its prior written consent (note exception below). No part of any NAFSA publication may be stored in a retrieval system or transmitted in any form or by any means, electronic, mechanical, photocopying, recording, scanning, or otherwise, except as permitted under Section 107 or 108 of the United States Copyright Act, without the prior written permission of the publisher. Permission is needed to reproduce or translate audio extracts in printed, recorded, or electronic format. To request permission, please submit your application in writing to Publications@nafsa.org. Include the following: Title of NAFSA publication, author(s) and/or editor(s), chapter, page numbers, and the name of the figures and tables as they appear in the NAFSA publication. Provide a brief statement on the purpose of the request and whether the NAFSA material will be posted on a website or in some electronic format.

Do I need permission to reuse, reproduce, or translate content included in the NAFSA Adviser's Manual?

The NAFSA *Adviser's Manual* is copyrighted by NAFSA: Association of International Educators. Materials from the NAFSA *Adviser's Manual* may not be recompiled, manipulated, used to prepare derivative works, or published or produced in another format without written permission from NAFSA. Systematic downloading, service bureau redistribution services, printing for fee-for-service purposes and/or the making of print or electronic copies for transmission to nonsubscribers are prohibited. Downloading portions of the NAFSA *Adviser's Manual* for the purpose of creating preloaded local copies (not including transient, dynamic caches of individually requested material) for redistribution is prohibited.

The person using the NAFSA *Adviser's Manual* may download, save, or print one hard copy of discreet sections of the text, search results, or other information provided that the content is only for their noncommercial, personal use. Any use of the NAFSA *Adviser's Manual* in whole or in part should include the customary bibliographic citation, including author attribution, date, article title, *The NAFSA Adviser's Manual*, and the URL www.nafsa.org. Do I need permission to reuse an article that I wrote for International Educator magazine?

Authors published in *International Educator* magazine sign an agreement that grants NAFSA, the publisher, permission to publish the work in both print and electronic form. Authors whose material appears in *IE* are free to use the material elsewhere with one exception: authors may not submit work to other publications covering the international education field. Please note that if the author wishes to republish an article in a source that is not in the international education field, permission still must be obtained from NAFSA.

Do I need permission to reproduce an excerpt?

NAFSA freely grants permission for the reproduction of text extracts of less than 400 words from a NAFSA book and text extracts of less than 150 words from a NAFSA booklet, electronic publication, or web page in another work. In such cases a request for permission need not be submitted, but the reproduced material must be accompanied by a full citation of the original source.

Can I share or use a graphic, info-graphic, video, or other multimedia item?

Permission is not required to *link to* any infographics, video, or multimedia on www.nafsa.org. Many images/art used in material copyrighted by NAFSA are controlled, not by NAFSA, but by the owner of the image. Please check the credit line adjacent to the illustration, as well as the front and back matter of the book for a list of credits. You must obtain permission directly from the owner of the image. Occasionally, NAFSA controls the rights to images or other drawings. Please direct permission requests for these images to Publications@nafsa.org.

Do I need permission for personal, noncommercial use?

You may print out a copy of a NAFSA publication for noncommercial, personal use. In the event of such use, all copyright and other notices and clear attribution to NAFSA must be maintained.

Do I need permission to make a photocopy of a NAFSA publication?

Permission is not required to photocopy a NAFSA publication for noncommercial use. Readers may make up to five (5) print copies of NAFSA content at no cost for personal, noncommercial use, provided that each copy includes a full citation of the source. Permission must be obtained from NAFSA if you are making more than five (5) print copies of NAFSA content for use as course material.
