NAFSA BOOKLET MANUSCRIPT GUIDELINES

NAFSA booklets are informative, introductory guides offering practical tips and advice on a wide range of topics, including U.S. classroom culture, good health abroad, and what parents need to know. These popular publications are written in a straightforward, clear tone for an intended audience of study abroad students, international students, and the families and friends of both. Advisers can purchase the booklets in bulk amounts for their offices to share and distribute with interested students. Booklets are typically between 6,000 and 7,000 words.

MANUSCRIPT GUIDELINES

- 1. Manuscripts must be submitted in Microsoft Word, double-spaced with 1-inch margins, and in 12-point Times New Roman font.
- 2. Please type only one space after periods and other terminal punctuation.
- 3. Include objective information; avoid opinion.
- 4. Use the pronouns he/she and his/her in place of them and their.
- 5. Be judicious in the use of abbreviations and acronyms. When using abbreviations for organizations in non-English-speaking countries, use the abbreviation that corresponds to the working language of that organization.
- 6. Try to avoid using typographical features such as capitalization, underlining, different fonts, and varying font sizes.
- 7. Refer to the *Chicago Manual of Style* (17th edition) for reference style. Footnotes are not allowed. Check the currency and accuracy of all URLs included or embedded in the manuscript.

- 8. Any images or figures in the manuscript must be high-resolution, in color, and in .eps, .pdf, or .jpg format. Do not embed the figures or tables directly into the manuscript text file.
- 9. Secure permission for all copyrighted material—figures, models, tables—included in the manuscript before production. Supply all permission forms to NAFSA Publishing Services with the final manuscript submission.
