Trainer Corps Position Description

Position: Trainer Corps Member

Last Updated: September 2016

Description: Trainer Corps is made up of approximately 300 volunteer trainers. Individual Trainer Corps members stay involved by serving in a variety of roles including CEP Workshop trainers, deans, lead trainers, and curriculum development team members to support and promote the NAFSA Core Education Program (CEP).

Functions and Responsibilities:

- Train at least one NAFSA CEP Workshop within a three year term and/or be active in one or more Trainer Corps involvement activities.
- When part of a CEP training team:
 - Participate in pre-workshop planning sessions via conference calls/virtual meetings, e-mail, and at the workshop location to ensure workshop effectiveness.
 - o Serve as an active member of the team.
 - Participate in workshop delivery.
 - Participate in debrief session with Lead Trainer and other trainers on team.
 - Provide feedback to lead trainer, workshop deans and NAFSA staff on any needed updates to CEP curriculum materials.
- Use CEP materials only at NAFSA approved training events.
- Participate in the Trainer Corps Induction Workshop upon acceptance and the Trainer Corps Enrichment workshop one time during any subsequent three year Trainer Corps term.
- Promote and represent the NAFSA Core Education Program and Trainer Corps in a variety of contexts.

Term of Service: Three years beginning upon completion of initial training of trainers program (Virtual Orientation and In-person Induction Workshop at the NAFSA Annual Conference). Term typically begins in June of the year of acceptance and ends the third year on June 30th. Ex: June 2017 – June 30th, 2020. Trainer Corps members may reapply for subsequent terms.

Time Commitment: Varies by role: see separate Trainer Corps position descriptions for more details (www.nafsa.org/trainercorps)

- Receive complementary training in training delivery for adult learners.
- Enhance your training delivery skills.
- Contribute your expertise to field of international education.
- Network with other International Education professionals.
- Represent the NAFSA Trainer Corps and Core Education Program in a variety of contexts.

Support:

Initial Trainer Corps training of trainers program includes:

- e. Various other involvement and enrichment opportunities throughout the year

Qualifications:

- NAFSA member.
- Five or more years of professional experience in the field of international education*.
- Demonstrated high level of proficiency/expertise in individual CEP Workshop content areas (www.nafsa.org/workshops).
- Experience or interest in professional development training for adults.
- Commitment to attend the NAFSA Annual Conference the year of initial induction into Trainer Corps.

*Subject Matter Experts with 3-5 years professional experience in certain CEP Workshop content areas will be considered.

Selection Process:

Trainer Corps applications are reviewed by NAFSA member leaders and current Trainer Corps members. Input is sought from regional and Knowledge Community leadership. Applications are accepted annually October – December, with notifications of acceptance sent out by late February.
