# **KOSOVO**



#### INTRODUCTION

Like Albania, Kosovar history is believed to date to Illyria in the 4th Century BC and to the Roman Empire. In the 9th to early 11th centuries, the Kosovo region was ruled by Bulgaria. From 1389 to the late 19th century, the region came under Ottoman rule; in the early 20th century, Kosovo was ruled by Serbia. In 1946, Kosovo became part of the Yugoslav federation. During the 1990's, Kosovo sought independence from Serbia, with brutal results, including mistreatment of ethnic Albanians; during the 2000's, the United Nations attempted to secure Kosovar independence, which is supported by Albania and rejected by Serbia. At this time, although technically still a part of Serbia, Kosovo is an international protectorate administered by the United Nations. Kosovo, a land-locked area, is bordered clockwise by Serbia, Macedonia, Albania, and Montenegro. The official name is the Republic of Kosovo (Kosova / Kosovë), with its capital at Pristina (Prishtina / Prishtinë). Population estimates vary from 1.8 to 2.2 million. With independence from Serbia declared on February 17, 2008, the Kosovar government is a parliamentary republic. Religious affliations are Muslim, Albanian Orthodox, and Roman Catholic; ethnic populations are Albanian, 88%; Serbs, 7%; and 5% other including Bosnian, Gorani, Roma / Gypsy, Ashkali, Egyptian, and Turkish. Although the official languages are Albanian and Serbian, Bosnian and Turkish are official in those municipalities with substantial minority populations; in addition, English and German are also spoken. Literacy rates vary from 92% to 98% for men and 88% to 90% for women.

Lower Cycle:

Grades I to V (Elementary Education) Approximate age of student: 6 to 11 Credential earned: N.A.

#### **Upper Cycle:**

Grades VI to IX (Lower Secondary / Middle School) Approximate age of student: 11 to 15 Credential earned: *Dëftesë* / Leaving Certificate, awarded upon completion of *shkollë nëntëvjeçare* (nine-year school)

# Upper Secondary: Grades X to XII

Approximate age of student: 15 to 18 Credential earned: *Diplomë* (Diploma), clarified as follows:

#### Academic Stream:


Type of institution: Shkollë e mesme – gjimanz (high school – gymnasium) Credential earned: Diplomë për Kryerjen e Shkollës së Mesmet të Përgjithshme-Gjimna (Diploma of Completion of General Secondary School – Gymnasium)

#### **Vocational Stream:**

Type of institution: *Shkollë e mesme profesionale* (vocational high school) Credential earned: *Diplomë për Kryerjen e Shkollës së Mesme Profesionale* (Diploma of Completion of Professional Secondary School)

Note: The *Diplomë* / Svjedočanstvo with technician or skilled worker qualification is a 3to 4-year terminal secondary-level vocational-technical credential which leads to the workforce, not to higher education; it does not equate to US high-school graduation.

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### USUAL SECONDARY GRADING:

Based on 1 to 5, with 2 as minimum passing grade:

Shkëlqyeshëm / 5 = excellent (4.00/A) Shumë mirë / 4 = very good (3.67/A- to 3.33/B+) Mirë / 3 = good (3.00/B) Mjaftueshëm / 2 = satisfactory (2.00/C) Pamjaftueshëm / 1 = unsatisfactory / failure (0.00 / F)

## EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM: TERTIARY

The Constitutional Framework for Provisional Self-Government in Kosovo (UNMIK Resolution No. 221/9 of 5-15-01) and the Provisional Institutions of Self-Government (of 3-02) govern Kosovar education under the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology. Although Kosovo is not yet a signatory of the European Higher Education Area (a.k.a. Bologna Process), Kosovar higher education, particularly at the University of Prishtina, is patterned after the EHEA, with three principal cycles.

### First Cycle or Stage:

Admission requirement: *Diplomë për Kryerjen e Shkollës së Mesmet të Përgjithshme-Gjimna* (Diploma of Completion of General Secondary School – Gymnasium) Duration: 6 semesters / 3 years / 180 ECTS (most majors) Coursework required: Yes Thesis required: Yes Credential earned: *Diplomë e Studimeve themelore* (Bachelor's Degree)

Note: The bachelor's degree in engineering requires 7 semesters / 210 ECTS. The bachelor's degrees in music and in Albanian language and literature require 8 semesters / 240 ECTS.

#### Second Cycle or Stage:

Admission requirement: *Diplomë e Studimeve themelore* (Bachelor's Degree) / comparable first-cycle credential Duration: 4 semesters / 2 years / 120 ECTS Coursework required: Yes Thesis required: Yes Credential earned: *Magjistër* (Master's Degree)

Note: Professional majors such as medicine, pharmacy, and dentistry are studied in university programs which incorporate both first and second cycles or stages. These programs generally require 10 semesters / 5 years (e.g., pharmacy and dentistry) to 12 semesters / 6 years (e.g., medicine).

#### Third Cycle or Stage:

Admission requirement: *Magjistër* (Master's Degree) / comparable secondcycle credential Duration: 3 years Coursework required: Research and study but not formal coursework Dissertation required: Yes Credential earned: *Doktor i Shkencave* (Doctor of Science)

#### **Teacher Training**

Admission requirement: Diplomë për Kryerjen e Shkollës së Mesmet të Përgjithshme-Gjimna (Diploma of Completion of General Secondary School – Gymnasium) Duration: 6 semesters / 3 years / 180 ECTS Coursework required: Yes Thesis required: N.A. Credential earned: Diplomë për Mësues të Ciklit të Shkollës nëntëvjeçare (Diploma for Teacher of Lower Cycle of 9-year School)
