Rescinding Requirement for Proof of Covid-19 Vaccination for All Airline or Other Aircraft Passengers Arriving into the United States From any Foreign Country

- On May 9, 2023, the President of the United States of America issued a <u>Proclamation</u> providing that vaccination requirements for noncitizen nonimmigrant air travelers contained in the <u>Presidential Proclamation Advancing the Safe Resumption of Global Travel During</u> the <u>COVID-19 Pandemic</u> will be terminated effective 12:01 a.m. Eastern Daylight Time on May 12, 2023.
- At that time, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Amended Order *Implementing Presidential Proclamation on Safe Resumption of Global Travel During the COVID-19 Pandemic* will cease to be in effect.
- This rescission takes effect for flights departing to the United States from a foreign country on or after 12:01am EDT on May 12, 2023. Noncitizen, nonimmigrant air passengers will no longer need to show proof of being fully vaccinated with an accepted COVID-19 vaccine to board a flight to the United States.
- Any questions concerning the scope or implementation of this guidance, should be directed to the appropriate Regional Carrier Liaison Group or other designated CBP official for adjudication prior to aircraft departure.
