IN REMEBERANCE

Jean-François Gounard began his career in International Education in 1964 at the University of Colorado at Boulder. He then moved onto the State University College at Buffalo where he served for 39 years. He was Director of International Student Affairs and Adjunct Professor of Educational Foundations. His last role at Buffalo State was from 2017-2018 serving as Director of Special International Programs. Gounard worked tirelessly to promote opportunities such as those provided by the Fulbright Program and Rhodes Scholarship program to students and to furthering Buffalo State's role in the city of Buffalo and its many "sister cities" programs around the world.

All of his education, including his doctorate was from the University of Bordeaux, France. He published three books and created over 25 journal articles in French and English on African-American Literature and International Education. He presented over 200 papers throughout the world and he was the recipient of many outstanding awards and honors including two Fulbright grants.

Jean Gounard was a NASFAn for 30 years. Beginning in 1992, he chaired the annual business meeting of the NAFSA Francophone World Special Interest Group. Gounard also co-chaired a session called "The Importance of NAFSA/Special Interest Group Worldwide."

Dr. Gounard passed away on October 1, 2020. We are grateful for his service to the field of international education and his support for thousands of students pursuing their degrees in the US as well as faculty in the Fulbright Program.

While this year Advocacy Day 2020 was canceled like many other events in this very unique year, it was certainly a super intense year for advocacy purposes! As we saw in the news, thanks to a huge advocacy effort, including the lawsuit initiated by Harvard and MIT which was joined by many other schools, the strict and unreasonable SEVP guidance published in the summer was rescinded. We also actively advocated against changes to the duration of status policy, which would pose a great burden on students without addressing real needs or issues. This policy change proposal received over 32,000 comments from stakeholders!

This has certainly been a difficult year for international education, challenges and difficulties to international mobility remain, for international students and scholars and for study abroad.



We look forward to continuing to be vocal to advocate for the value and the importance of international education! And, we hope to see a different and more welcoming set of policies coming out of the new administration.



As we all know this has been an incredibly active year. Full of regulatory changes and presidential proclamations (many in reaction to the pandemic), there has been much to keep track of. In brief:

- <u>Public Charge Final Rule</u>
- <u>Immigration Executive Actions</u>
- USCIS Fee Rule
- <u>Elimination of D/S Proposed Rule</u>
- <u>USCIS Emergency Stopgap Act</u>
- Interim Final Rule on OES and Prevailing Wage Determinations
- <u>Interim Final Rule on Strengthening the H-1B Classification</u>



While we could not meet face-to-face, this year we hosted a number of events starting with a virtual webinar with SEVP Field Representatives in June. As part of the 2020 Region X Virtual Conference, we also put together a few agency-focused sessions to highlight and discuss many of the challenges we have all been facing. These included our USCIS Current Issues, Travel Hot Topics and SEVIS Hot Topics sessions. Unfortunately, we did not have agency participation at the regional level, so in lieu of this, NAFSA's ISS RP Subcommittees assisted regions by recording sessions with agency participation which are available to everyone and can be found on the NAFSA website <u>here</u>.

Also, if you haven't taken advantage of it yet, please note that <u>IssueNet</u> is back up and running! The revamped site still offers the Get Liaison Help function you may use to contact us for case specific assistance, as well as the Report an Issue function that helps ISS RP keep track of all of the on-going issues across the country. With the data compiled through Report an Issue, we can continue to bring issues to the appropriate government agencies. There is strength in reporting!
